For members to receive EVITP credentials:

1. Enroll by following the directions in the attached flier.
2. Inform your business manager OR educational director of your enrollment.
3. Complete the 20-hour EVITP course (online, in-person, or a combination of both) as soon as possible.
4. Once you pass the certification test, send the results to your business manager or educational director to receive credentials and be counted in the weekly report to International Vice Presidents.

About EVITP: The Electric Vehicle Infrastructure Training Program (EVITP) provides the most comprehensive training and certification for the installation of electric vehicle supply equipment in North America. More than a technical installation course, EVITP offers a full overview of the electric vehicle industry including applicable building codes, load calculations, commissioning, troubleshooting, and customer relations.

About the Class:

The class is presented in a hybrid structure with the course materials presented online and through in-person lectures.

Online portion: (estimated 8-12 hours)

The online portion of the class utilizes the Electrical Training Alliance computer mediated course that includes training modules and quiz type questions. The time commitment for this portion of the class is estimated at 8-12 hours. Participants will be required to have a computer (laptop or PC) and internet access to complete the course.



In-person portion: (12 hours)

The in-person portion of the class will consist of four evening sessions on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 5 – 8:30PM at the Puget Sound Electrical JATC.

Certification:

To be eligible for EVITP certification, a participant must be a state licensed electrician. To become certified, participants must complete the EVITP course and successfully pass the EVITP certification exam.

Cost:

For those requiring certification the exam fee is \$45.00. (There is no class fee to IBEW L.U. #46 Members)
