This accolade honors those within the state labor movement who embody Mary "Mother" Jones's rallying cry, "Mourn for the dead, but fight like hell for the living!". Mother Jones was a unique organizer who welcomed African American workers and involved women and children in strikes. She organized miners' wives to guard against scabs and staged parades with children advocating for education over mining. The award is bestowed yearly upon one individual and one organization.
